God is an amazing God! Over the course of the last year and a half, God has been inspiring a few women in our church to create Blessing Bags for the homeless and downtrodden.


The initial bags were basic and crude but did the job. It was a simple brown lunch paper bag with a few nonperishable lunch items that was handed out (mainly pre-COVID) to people holding up signs at local shopping plazas looking for handouts.

Recently, God has inspired other women in our church with similar ideas, but has taken it up a notch! Simultaneously without these women knowing, God inspired two of these groups to purchase drawstring backpacks to put food and comfort items in them with a spiritual note attached (see the photo to the right that one of our members created).

Concord Church's own Soap Hope ministry contributed to the bags because our the generous donations it received to supply hygiene products.

The idea behind the drawstring backpack is that it can double as a care package as well as a useful tool to carry their personal belongings.
