

Join us Sabbath afternoon for a walk in the wilderness. There are numerous wooded trails that meander around the Ipswich River, ponds, and wetlands. Bring your birdseed to feed the birds right out of your hands (the birds like black sunflower seeds best). You might catch a glimpse of deer as sunset approaches.

This is an excellent opportunity for friendship evangelism by inviting our friends who do not know Jesus so they can interact with Christians outside of church.

Go to https://www.massaudubon.org/get-outdoors/wildlife-sanctuaries/ipswichriver to reserve your Parking Pass/Entry Ticket. The cost is \$12.24 per vehicle or free if you are a Massachusetts Audubon Member or an active US military member. Online ticket sales are active anywhere from 3-7 days prior to the date of visit, and only 16 cars are allowed per half hour. Start checking the site a week in advance and purchase your ticket for 3:30pm. Spots sell out fast in the spring, so reserve well in advance.

Please note: Restrooms at the sanctuary are closed due to COVID. Stop & Shop; 301 Newbury Street, Danvers is close by. You may want to stop there prior or after the visit.

Sabbath School God's Everlasting Covenant

This quarter, entitled The Promise: God's Everlasting Covenant, will look more closely at what God's covenant is, what it offers, and even at what it demands. Though drawn from many sources, the lessons rely heavily on work of the late Dr. Gerhard F. Hasel.

God's covenant is motivated by love, His love for the fallen race, a love that led Him to the Cross. It is because of what Christ has done for us that we love God back, and we surrender our sinful ways to Him as well as our fears. We do this because we have been given the best that God can give—Jesus Christ and the redemption found only in Him.

How does it all work? It is as simple as an exchange: Christ takes our sins and gives us His righteousness so that, through Him, we are accounted as righteous as God Himself. In this way, sin is no longer attributed to us; it no longer has to keep us separated from Him. And this wonderful gift, this accounting of righteousness, comes to us by faith, and faith alone. Hence the phrase, "righteousness by faith."

But it does not end there, either. Sinners can, through Jesus, enter into a relationship with God, because Jesus' blood brings not only forgiveness but cleaning, healing, and restoration. We are, through Christ, born again, and through this experience God writes His holy law upon our hearts. Thus, sinners no longer do the things they used to do. From and by this inward law, all of life is shaped for the believer. These people desire to work out what God puts within them, and that desire is matched with the promise of Divine power. Here is the essence of what it means to live in covenant relationship with God that we will study this quarter.
